## **2017 was one for the books...**

Your continued support and dedication has helped us accomplish feats we never thought possible. Since Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation was founded in 2013, our goal has been to give back and help others on Long Island. One of the founding fathers of Adventureland, Tony Gentile, had a knack for business, passion for family, commitment to education, and dedication to the Long Island community. Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation wishes to honor those traits and values while continuing his legacy.

Our Tony Gentile Memorial Scholarship program received very exciting news this past spring; **our friends at The Sachem Dental Group, awarded our foundation a \$50,000 endowment!** Over the past 4 years, we have donated nearly \$30,000 in scholarships to Long Island students. Now with the incredible support from the Sachem Dental Group, the Tony Gentile Memorial Scholarship program will live on in eternity.

Our Helping Hands Foundation has also implemented three annual goods drives at Adventureland, enabling us to donate **thousands of toys, school supplies, and pounds of food** to Long Islanders in need. We also held our first Coats For A Cause Drive this year, allowing us to donate hundreds of coats to the Long Island Coalition for the Homeless.

This year, in addition to securing over \$200,000 monetary and in-kind donations, we continued to build up our bottle recycling program within the staff of Adventureland. We strengthened our grant program for local non-profits, and hosted our first major fundraising event this past September.

Recipients of the Tony Gentile Memorial Scholarship were selected by the board of Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation based on their dedication to the greater Long Island community. Each award winner received a \$1,000 check towards their freshman tuition at a Long Island College or University. Joshua Soto, the Dollars for Scholars recipient, was selected by the William Floyd School District. Students in the district raised funds for this scholarship that were then matched by Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation.

# 2017 School Supply Drive

How we “coasted” our way to  
more than doubling our donation to local schools

This year’s school supply drive was met with an overwhelming amount of support, thanks to a relatively little known American holiday; **National Roller Coaster Day**. On Wednesday, August 16th, Adventureland marked the anniversary of the first stateside roller coaster patent with **FREE** rides on the iconic Turbulence roller coaster and its counterpart (that still packs a punch), the Lady Bug roller coaster, for those who made a donation of school supplies. With the support of News12 anchor and roller coaster



enthusiast, Elizabeth Hashagen, and the rest of our Channel 12 family, word of our school supply drive quickly spread throughout the Long Island community. Combined with the support of our friends at Cox Media’s 106.1 BLI and WBAB 102.3, and Adventureland’s social media team, our school supply drive gained so much momentum that we collected thousands of supplies in one day! Adventureland has already committed to the same National Roller Coaster Day program for 2018. We plan to make this an annual tradition of midsummer giving!



To further show their dedication to our cause, Cox Media hosted a Back to School Bash at Adventureland on September 9th (which generated school supply donations) and they made a donation of 2,000 backpacks.

Being able to channel the masses to give back to the local community on our behalf is an incredible gift. We thank our friends at WBAB and WBLI for all they continue to do to show their support.

Adventureland’s Helping Hands Foundation selected one school in Suffolk County and one school in Nassau County to receive the donations we collected. The beneficiaries were the Park Avenue Elementary School in Amityville and Northern Parkway Elementary School in Uniondale. With the support of the entire Long Island community, we were able to donate over 2,500 backpacks, thousands of notebooks, pencils, crayons, and more to the island’s most vulnerable young students. Our hope is for every student to start the school year prepared, confident, and ready to learn.

# Thanksgiving Food Drive 2017

Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation hosted the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Fall Food Drive this year benefitting the Town of Babylon Food Pantry and Long Island Harvest. **We donated 100 turkeys and 100 Thanksgiving Baskets filled with all the trimmings to the Town of Babylon, and an additional 350lbs of food to Long Island Harvest!** This means our foundation will feed over 2,000 Long Islanders in need this holiday season.

The Town of Babylon is the most densely populated municipality in Suffolk County, where nearly 6% of residents live below the poverty line. The Town of Babylon Pantry is open year-round to all Town of Babylon residents in need.

Long Island Harvest serves over 300,000 Nassau and Suffolk County residents in need through supporting over 500 soup kitchens and food pantries. Millions of meals are distributed to adults, children, seniors, families and veterans each year through Long Island Harvest.

This year, Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation partnered with DiCarlo Food Services, Connoisseur Media, and Moe's Southwest Grille. We also received hundreds of dollars in support from Aldi Food Stores and Stop & Shop. Nonperishable food donations and gift card donations were accepted weekends and holidays at Adventureland throughout September and October. All donors received a free giveaway.

## *\$10,000 Awarded to the Five Tony Gentile Employee Scholarship Recipients*

While Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation has implemented numerous drives and awarded thousands of dollars in grants, it is, at its core, a scholarship program. The Tony Gentile Memorial Scholarship consists of two components; the first is focused on supporting higher education for Long Island High School Seniors who will be attending colleges and universities on Long Island. The second component focuses on supporting members of the Adventureland Family on their journey to higher education, no matter where they go to school.

**The first annual Tony Gentile Memorial Employee Scholarship reception took place on August 15<sup>th</sup>,**

**and each of the recipients were awarded \$2,000 towards their 2017-2018 full-time student tuitions.** Applicants were selected by the board based on two short essays; one explaining how they possess the same dedication to the community, commitment to education, and devotion to family as Tony Gentile and the other focused on their experiences at Adventureland and how it would help them in the future.

## The Gerald Ryan Outreach Center

This summer, Adventureland's Helping Hands Foundation donated 125 basketballs to the Gerald J. Ryan Outreach Center's basketball clinic, and sponsored snack and drinks for over 150 kids at the outreach center's camp for a whole week. Our foundation is honored to have the opportunity to give back to the children at the center, and we were ecstatic when Alfie was invited to join the kids at the clinic and show them some moves!

The Gerald J. Ryan Outreach Center is one of the largest outreach centers in one of the neediest communities on Long Island. Located in Wyandanch, they support an average of 1,000 people per month with food, clothing, immigration and



translation services and a host of other services. Two thirds of their clients are children.

Additionally, the Gerald J. Ryan Outreach runs a summer camp, which has been in existence for over 35 years. They host about 150 kids for six weeks. Nearly 25% of the campers are homeless, living in shelters, or are foster children. Camp activities include educational enrichment and games, arts/

crafts, outdoor play like basketball, soccer, jump rope, and hop scotch, and trips to the North Lindenhurst Pool, Adventureland and the beach.

## The Life & Legacy of Tony Gentile

### *Our Father, Our Friend, and Forever Our Rock.*

Adventureland has been a Long Island institution since 1962; providing a safe place for generations of families to spend time together and to make memories has been the goal of the Farmingdale amusement park since its inception. Although many Long Islanders are familiar with the park's classic rides, tasty treats and annual traditions like Pumpkin Park and fund-raising nights, only few were lucky enough to know one of the men behind the Adventureland we know and love.

Tony Gentile was many things; a risk taking businessman, an apprenticed butcher, a New Yorker from Brooklyn just to name a few. However, first and foremost, he was a family man. The father of 5, grandfather of 17, married Vivian, the love of his life, after they met in business school. Tony began a lifelong journey into the business world, with nothing but the support of his family and friends. His first job was as a butcher in Brooklyn. By the time he was a young parent, he and his two younger brothers eventually outgrew the small butcher store they worked in and decided to pursue the opportunities in the Brooklyn meat market. Soon after however, the grueling hours, the long commute and the changing atmosphere of the meat industry caused Tony and his brother Johnny to answer an ad in the paper that read "Fast Food Restaurant For Sale at a Local Amusement Park." Along with their dear friends and business partners, Peter Amoruso and Dominic Cosola, this partnership purchased what is now the Adventureland Restaurant in the late 1970s. Despite not having any experience in the restaurant industry, the foursome knew they had what it takes to run a successful business together.

Tony was able to use his background in accounting to run and operate the financial end of the restaurant, while Johnny and Pete oversaw the day to day operations of the business and staff, which they continue to do today. In the early 1980s the opportunity arose to expand their involvement and invest in the running of the entire amusement park. The situation of the park was as grim as when the four man partnership took over the restaurant. They decided this was a rare but wonderful opportunity; the restaurant had turned into a healthy business and they knew they were good partners. It was decided that Tony would manage the park, and Johnny and Pete would run the restaurant.

Fast forward to the 1990s; Adventureland is establishing itself as a local landmark with new and innovative rides, live music and new games. During this time Tony and his team created community events like Pumpkin Park, designed as a safe Halloween event for Long Island families, developed philanthropic relationships with local nonprofits like The Helen Keller School, and became more and more involved with community groups like Boy Scouts & Girl Scouts and Nassau-Suffolk Services for Autism. The Adventureland team decided to take on

new business ventures in family entertainment, and with the help of long time associates Chip Cleary and Udo Stork, they built Splish Splash and Bullwinkle's (now Boomers), both of which were sold in 1999.

Tony Gentile left behind a legacy that millions of Long Islanders continue to be a part of today. Adventureland, Splish Splash, and Bullwinkle's were founded on the ideals of family fun close to home. His philanthropy in the Long Island community continues through Adventureland and the Helping Hands Foundation. Today, the children and grandchildren of the successful partnership are moving Adventureland forward and continue to bring the local landmark to the next level of Long Island family fun.
